The assessment will take place in the same room at **10am on Saturday 17 August** and will provide students with the opportunity for a conditional early offer\* to a number of courses run by the School of Social Sciences and Psychology, including: Bachelor of Social Science (Pathway to Master of Urban Management and Planning), Bachelor of Tourism Management and Bachelor of Social Science with Geography and Urban Studies, Heritage and Peace and Development majors. Not only is this a great chance to practice applying the case-studies to HSC style questions, but an excellent opportunity to secure an early offer\* to high UAC ranking courses before the HSC (the Urban Planning and Tourism Management degrees at UWS are the top ATAR tourism and planning programs in NSW).
