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




"In the classroom we have allowed one voice to speak for all, and by asking the question 'Does everyone understand?'; we have not heard from the silent majority of the class who could have significant gaps in their learning. This is the main reason why most of the checking for understanding done in schools is ineffective" (Fisher & Frey 2007)

What is formative assessment?

"evidence about student achievement is elicited, interpreted, and used by teachers, learner, or their peers, to make decisions about the next steps in instruction that are likely to be better, or be better founded, than the decisions they would have taken in the absence of the evidence that was elicited."

Black and Wiliam, 2007

Formative Assessment - Some guidelines

- Must have a clear link to the learning goals and success criteria of the lesson
- Must be timely
- The information must be used to determine the learning of the students in the next lesson


Plickers is a powerfully simple tool that lets teachers collect real-time formative assessment data without the need for student devices
