Content focus: The unit culminates in this lesson where students have the opportunity to present their representation of the Q Station and respond to the overarching question of this unit: Why is the Q Station an important place? The formality of assessment and whether it becomes a peer assessed (or equivalent) activity is at the discretion of the classroom teacher.		 Resources: Facility or space for students to present their representation of the Q Station. All resource sheets and captured responses from Lessons 1–7 (as required). Q Station website: https://www.qstation.com.au (as required) A facility to capture and store student responses during the lesson so they can be added to and referred to throughout the unit. This could be achieved through digital and/or non-digital means.

Why is the Q Station an important place?	A student: • communicates reasons why the Q Station is an important place.	 Step 1: Students are reminded about the appropriate behaviour when listening to other students present their work. Step 2: Students take turns to present their work. In doing so they share some information about why the Q Station is an important place. Step 3: The teacher draws together the key points raised in the presentations. Step 4: Students complete the following sentence in verbal or written (digital or paper) form: To me, the most interesting part of learning about why the Q Station is an important place was (students are encouraged to provide a reason why).
