Lesson 2: Personal places and Aboriginal people		
<b>Content focus:</b> In this lesson students investigate a personal place of importance to Indigenous (Aboriginal) Australians, their traditional homes. They also have the opportunity to discuss Aboringal peoples' connections with land, sea and the animals of their place.		Resources:         • Teaching Resource: 'Aboriginal Homes' PowerPoint         • Worksheet 1: Comparing homes
<ul> <li>Key inquiry questions:</li> <li>How does the concept of 'home' for Aboriginal people differ from that of non-Aboriginal people?</li> <li>How are people connected to places?</li> <li>What factors affect people's connections to places?</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Outcomes: A student:</li> <li>Identifies how the concept of 'home', from the perspective, differs from that of non-Aboriginal Australians</li> <li>describes features of places and the connections people have with places</li> <li>communicates geographical information and uses geographical tools for inquiry.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Lesson sequence:</li> <li>Step 1: Ask students "What is a home?" Record responses.</li> <li>Step 2: Ask students "Who are the Aboriginal people?" Discuss.</li> <li>Step 3: Tell students that Aboriginal people have a different understanding of 'home' than non-Aboriginal people. They have strong attachment to traditional lands and extended kinship systems. The Aboriginal people don't think of 'home' as a particular dwelling.</li> <li>Step 4: Show students the PowerPoint 'Aboriginal Homes'. Discuss each slide to ensure students have a deep understanding.</li> <li>Step 5: Students are asked to consider what is the same and what is different between their home and a traditional Aboriginal person's home using 'Lesson 2 Worksheet 1'.</li> <li>Step 6: Student's share responses to Worksheet 1: Comparing Homes. To promote discussion and analysis ask: <ul> <li>Were the homes similar or quite different? Explain.</li> <li>Does everyone need a home/personal place?</li> <li>Is it important that people's personal places are the way they like them? Why?</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

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
