Process: Read about one place. Read about the other. Highlight any things that are similar. What is different? As a class, write a paragraph (or use the one below) identifying what is similar and different between the two places. Provide reasons for the similarities and differences between the two places. What conclusions can you draw from the geographical information and dat you have collected? For example: Sydney is located on the island of Australia in the southern hemispheres. Indonesia, however, is made up of thousands of islands that are located in both the northern and southern hemispheres. Indonesia is right on the equator whereas Australia is further south. This explains why Sydney has a temperate climate and has all four relatively distinct seasons where as indonesis is a tropical climate (hot and well religiteent as well.
